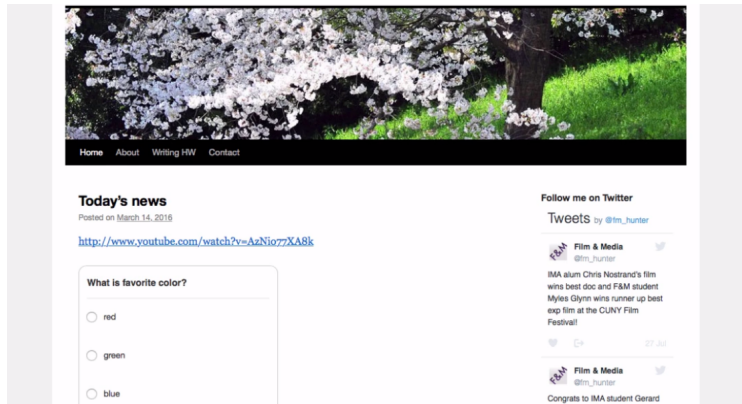


Setting the homepage in Wordpress



By default your Wordpress site will display your most recent posts on your home page. Lets say you would like your *About* page to be your home page and a page we will create called *Blog*, to display all of your posts.

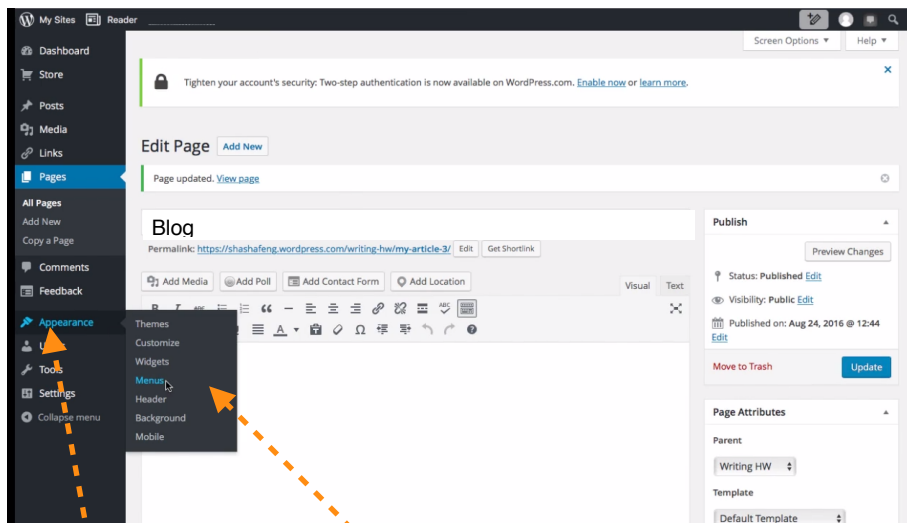
Page Title

1. First we will create a page and title it *Blog* and click ***publish***.

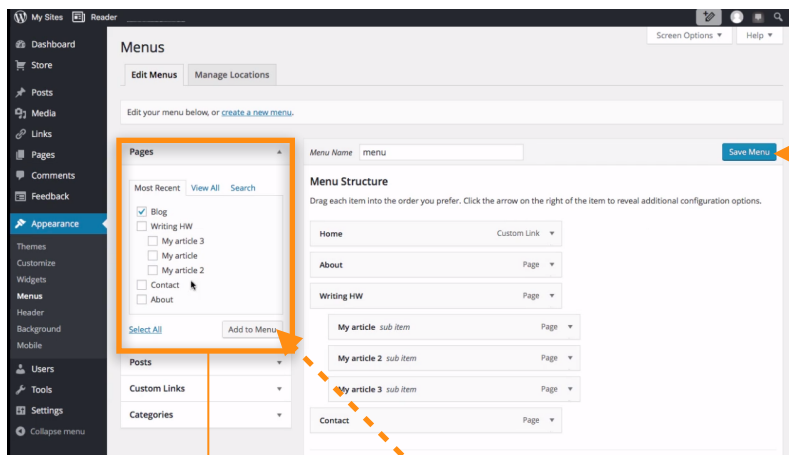

2. Next, hover over **Appearances** and click on **Menus**.

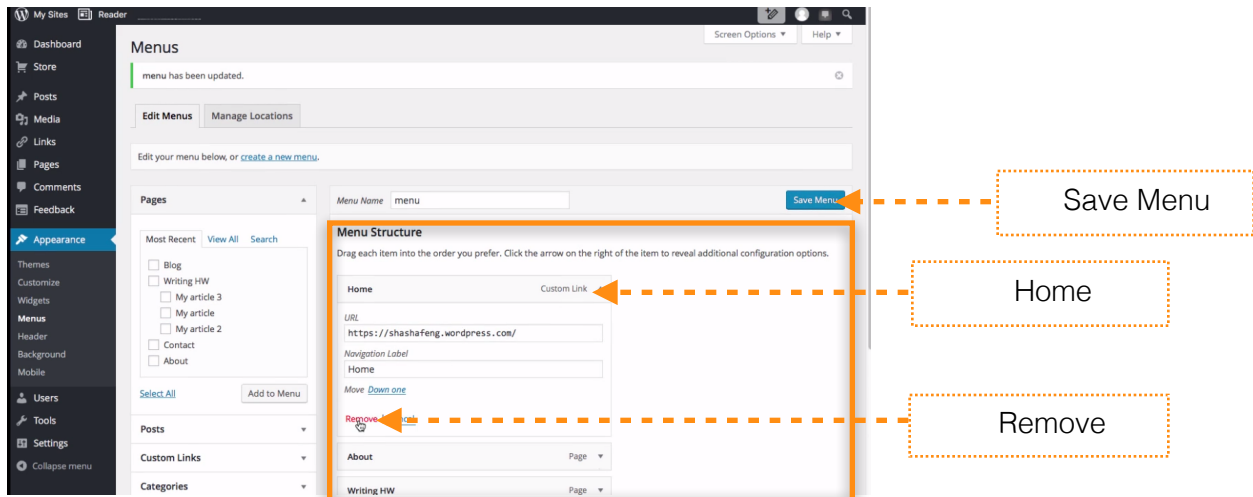

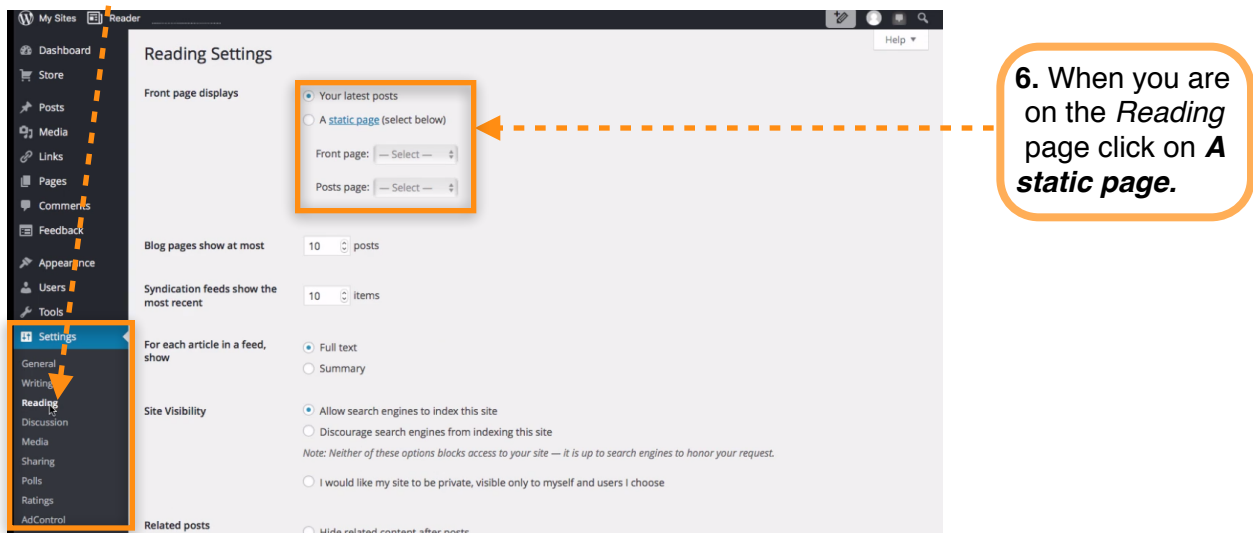
3. Find the **Blog** page we created, select it and click **Add to Menu**.

Add to Menu

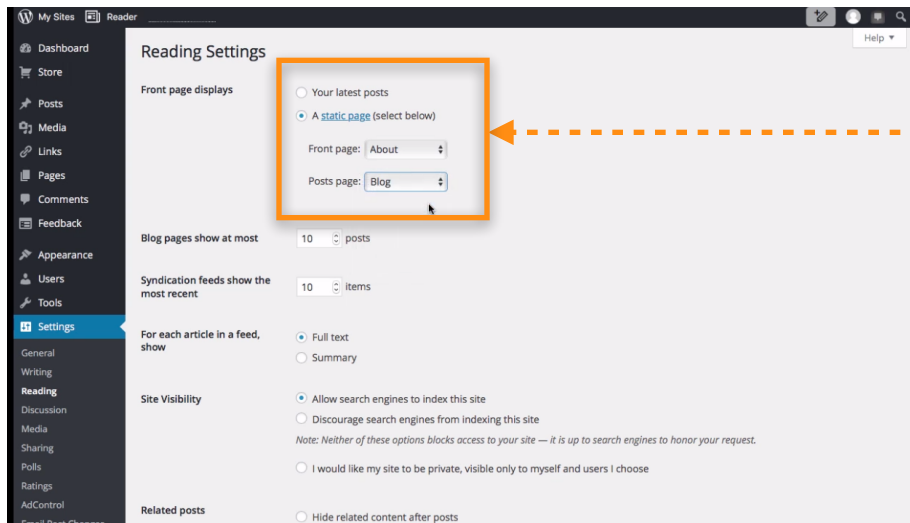


4. On this section click on **Home** and then **Remove**. Once you are done click on **Save Menu**.

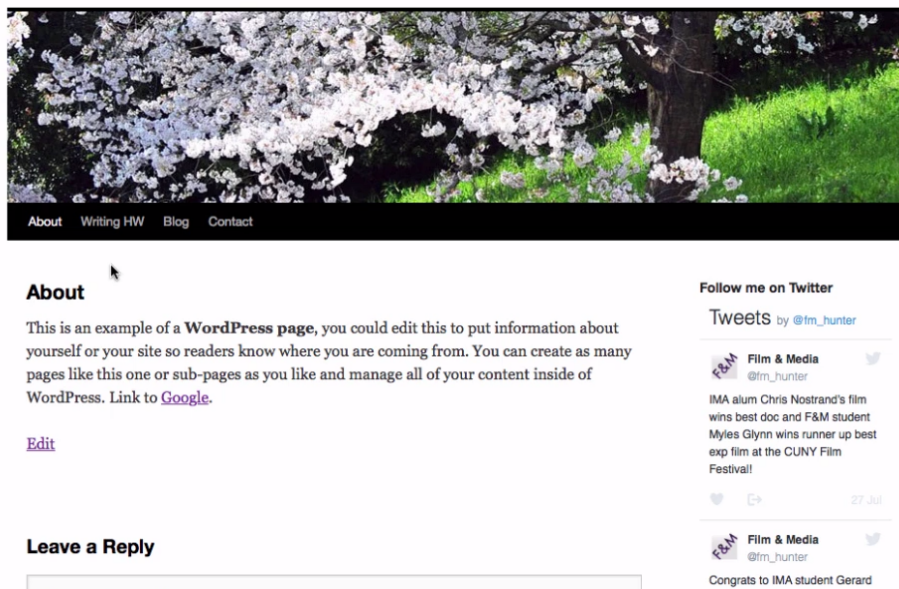
5. Next under **Settings**, click on **Reading**



6. When you are on the **Reading** page click on **A static page**.



7. Change the front page attribute to **About** and the posts page attribute to **Blog**. When you are done, scroll down and click **Save Changes**.



Refresh your home page and you should see that your about page is your home page. Furthermore all of your posts are now in your **Blog** page.
